Title 9 Training

To promote a culture of respect on campus, all college students in the United States must complete a sexual misconduct and violence awareness and prevention education program. At CSUN this training is online, interactive and video-based, featuring real-life student testimonials.

All students who are required to take the training will have a "Title IX Not Anymore" registration hold that prevents enrollment in classes. Once the training is completed, the hold will be removed within 24 hours.

Students will have a clearer understanding of their role as active learners and their academic objectives as they move forward in their chosen educational path.

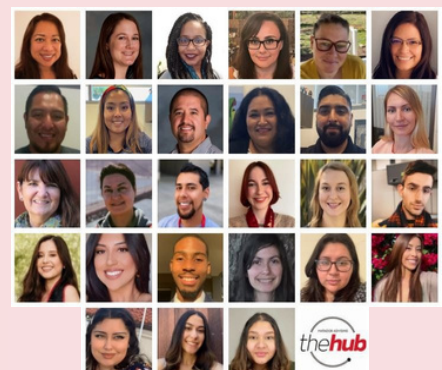


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
