



INTELLECTUAL PROPERTY LAW - BLAW 450

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OFFICE HOURS: Tuesday & Thursday, 12:00 - 12:30 pm on Zoom, and by appointment

Course Description

This course provides an introduction to the law of patents, copyrights, trademarks, trade secrets, and related forms of intellectual property protection. Considered will be the nature of intellectual property rights and the scope of protection for various subject matter, including international and trade aspects relating to technology protection and transfer; the enforcement of intellectual property rights and remedies for infringement or misappropriation of such rights; and practical strategies for intellectual property development, management, and licensing in the modern business environment. *Prerequisites:* BLAW 280; BUS 302, 302L for BSBA majors; passing score on the Upper-Division writing Proficiency Exam (WPE).

Course Objectives

You will gain an understanding of the various legal rules that apply to decision-making in the business environment, and to use these rules to manage legal risk and make ethical decisions. You will develop your analytical, argumentation, and writing skills by reading and briefing court decisions, identifying legal issues and legally relevant facts, using rules and facts to support an argument, and applying rules through oral discussion of cases and hypothetical problems in class and through written analysis on examinations.

Required Texts

The textbook for this course is SAUNDERS, INTELLECTUAL PROPERTY LAW: LEGAL ASPECTS OF INNOVATION AND COMPETITION (2016). Class Preparation and Participation

The course will be conducted through use of assigned readings, written case briefs and discussion answers, and online chat discussion sessions. *You must check Canvas regularly for announcements, assignments, deadlines, and other course information.* Preparation entails reading the assigned materials, listening to the recorded audio lectures and briefing the assigned cases. As you read the text and listen to the audio lectures, you should take notes on the outline provided for each lecture.

Part of your final grade will be based on your participation in chat discussion sessions and in discussions on the Canvas discussion board. *Participation is more than attendance in chat sessions and time spent on Canvas.* You are strongly encouraged to attend and actively participate in class chat sessions and to respond the questions posted for threaded discussions on Canvas/Discussions. I also encourage each of you to meet with me at least once during the

semester during my Zoom office hour after each chat discussion. I will monitor your participation and post your participation score at the end of the course.

Method of Assessment

You must brief assigned cases for each lecture. Case briefing involves summarizing a court opinion. If you have never briefed a case before, you should study the slides entitled “Briefing the *Metallurgical Industries Case*” posted on Canvas/Modules. Even if you learned how to brief cases previously, it is worth reviewing these slides so you understand my expectations as to format. Before each chat discussion, you have the option of submitting specified briefs for one (1) extra credit point per brief. *If your brief does not follow the format described in the slides, however, you will not receive an extra credit point.*

Your final letter grade will be calculated on a curve based on the total number of points you accumulate out of a possible 135 points according to the following:

The final grade will be based on a class curve. Any extra credit points accumulated will be added *after* the class curve is created based on 135 points. Plus and minus grading will be applied for the final grade.

Examinations will include both multiple choice questions and one or more essay questions. The essay questions will require you to analyze factual situations, identify legal issues, and apply the law in determining the outcome of hypothetical cases. Essay answers must follow the IRAC format. Answers must provide an analysis of the issue by applying legal rules to the facts to provide reasons for a conclusion. If you are unfamiliar with this structure of organizing a legal analysis, study the handout “IRAC Analysis” that is posted on Canvas/Modules. *If your essay answers are not structured in IRAC format, you will not receive full credit for the answer.*

You will be able to use your textbook, notes, and outlines during the exams. Except in emergency or unforeseeable circumstances that can be documented, there are *no make-up examinations*.
