

## What is the CSET Multiple Subject?

The California Subject Examination Test: Multiple Subject is a test consisting of multiple choice and short response questions. It is designed to measure knowledge and critical thinking skills of future elementary school teachers. The following are the three subtest areas:

- ❖ **Subtest #1:** Reading, Language and Literature, History and Social Science
- ❖ **Subtest #2:** Science and Mathematics
- ❖ **Subtest #3:** Physical Education, Human Development, Visual and Performing Arts

### ***If I plan to complete ITEP-Junior Option, When do I need to pass the CSET:MS?***

You must show passage of all three subtests prior to the semester you plan to do the first semester of student teaching.

### ***How can I prepare for the test?***

There are many ways to prepare for the CSET:

1. The best way to prepare is to complete your subject matter courses in the major before attempting each subtest. Please check the back of this handout for the recommended sequence of classes prior to taking the test.
