- v. Collaborate to create well organized and well supported documents that effectively communicate ideas.
- vi. Generate, understand, retrieve, and use qualitative and/or quantitative data from libraries, field sites, and electronic environments in order to refine and support their ideas.
- vii. Locate, research, and contemplate a social issue in order to develop a written stance toward that issue.
