English 315: Digital Writing

Qualifications

Master's Degree or Ph.D. or terminal degree in English or in Rhetoric and Composition, with specialization in digital media and composition, or in related field.

Two years' experience and documented effectiveness in teaching writing at the college level.

Commitment to implementing English 315 course goals.

Evidence of certification in online teaching (QLT, ACUE, etc.) is required for assignment to online courses.

Desirable Qualifications:

Expertise and experience in production and distribution of texts in multiple digital media- video, audio, imagery, web, animation, and interactive online platforms. Experience working with English Language Learners. Experience working with international students.

Salary Range

Base Rate: Anticipated hiring range from \$1812 to \$2162 per weighted teaching unit based on degrees and qualifications. A 3-unit lecture/discussion course thus ranges from \$5436 to \$6486.

- Gain experience with a variety of digital writing tolls and platforms.
- Explore the rhetorical effects of different media.
- Build Upon their current levels of experience and expertise with digital writing.
- Read a series of texts that explore practical and philosophical issues related to digital writing.

These documents must be submitted to the address in the section below.
