

Featuring the Administrative Credential Program

Did You Know That...

The Department of Educational Leadership and Policy Studies (ELPS) provides a Preliminary Administrative Services Credential Program for candidates interested in an administrative or supervisory position. Through LINCS, data has been collected on fieldwork assignments, identifying CSUN's school and district partners in the preparation of administrative services credential candidates. During the academic year 2021-22, ELPS provided field assignments for 71 candidates. Of these assignments, 52 candidates (73%) were in LAUSD area schools, including LAUSD noncharters (61%), and LAUSD affiliated charters (1%) and independent charters (11%). In addition to LAUSD, 19 (27%) candidates were at 6 school districts, 5 private schools, 2 community-based organizations, 1 charter school, and a county office.
