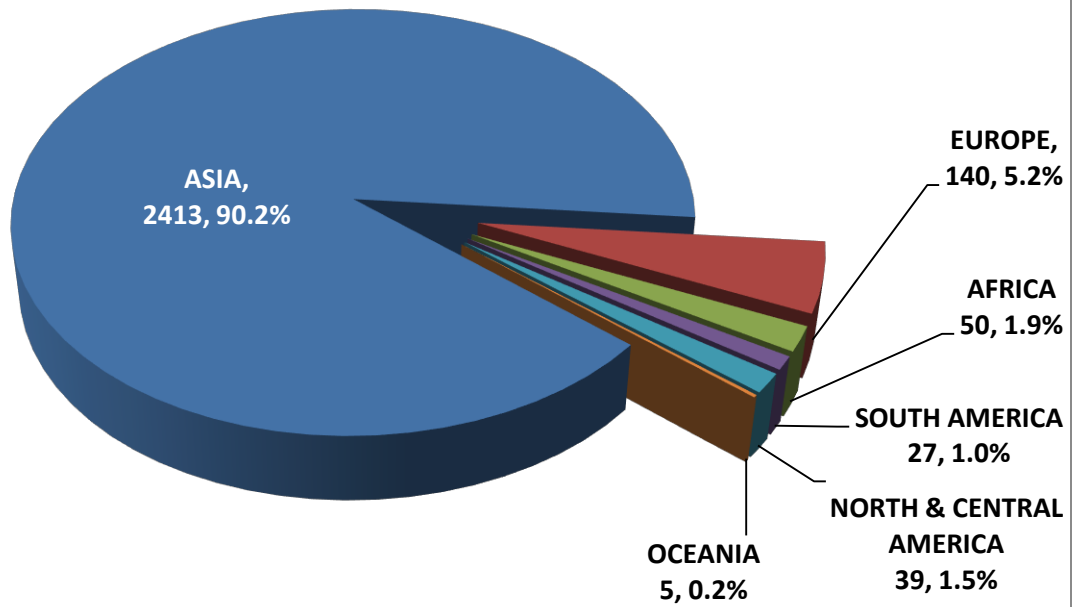

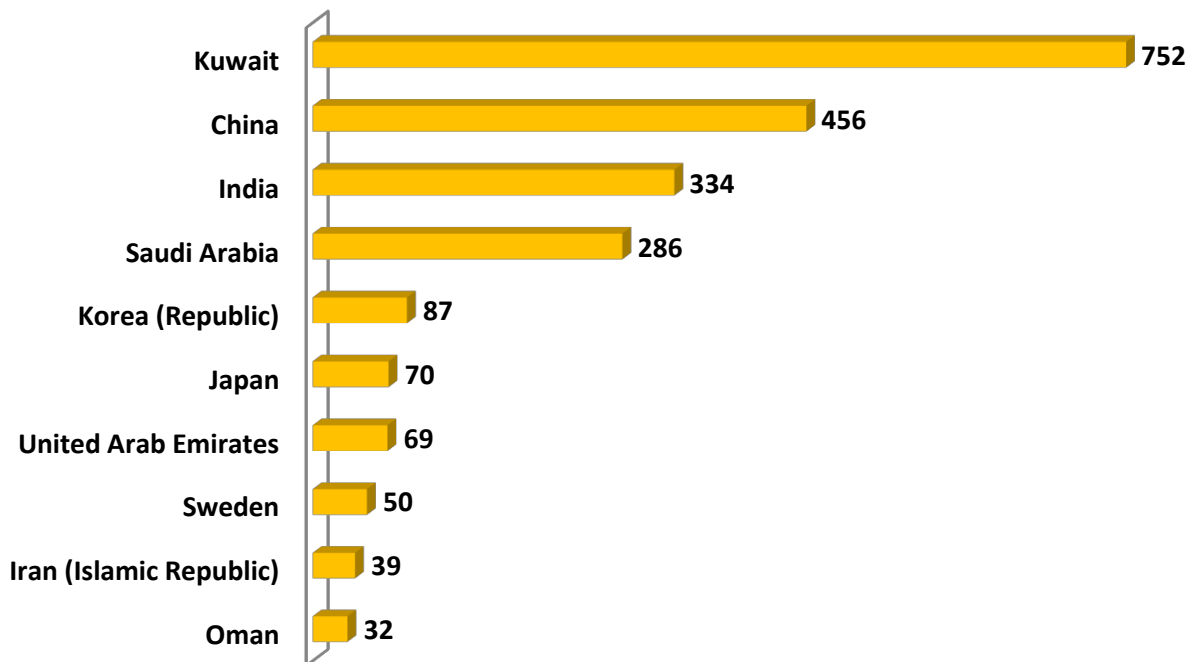

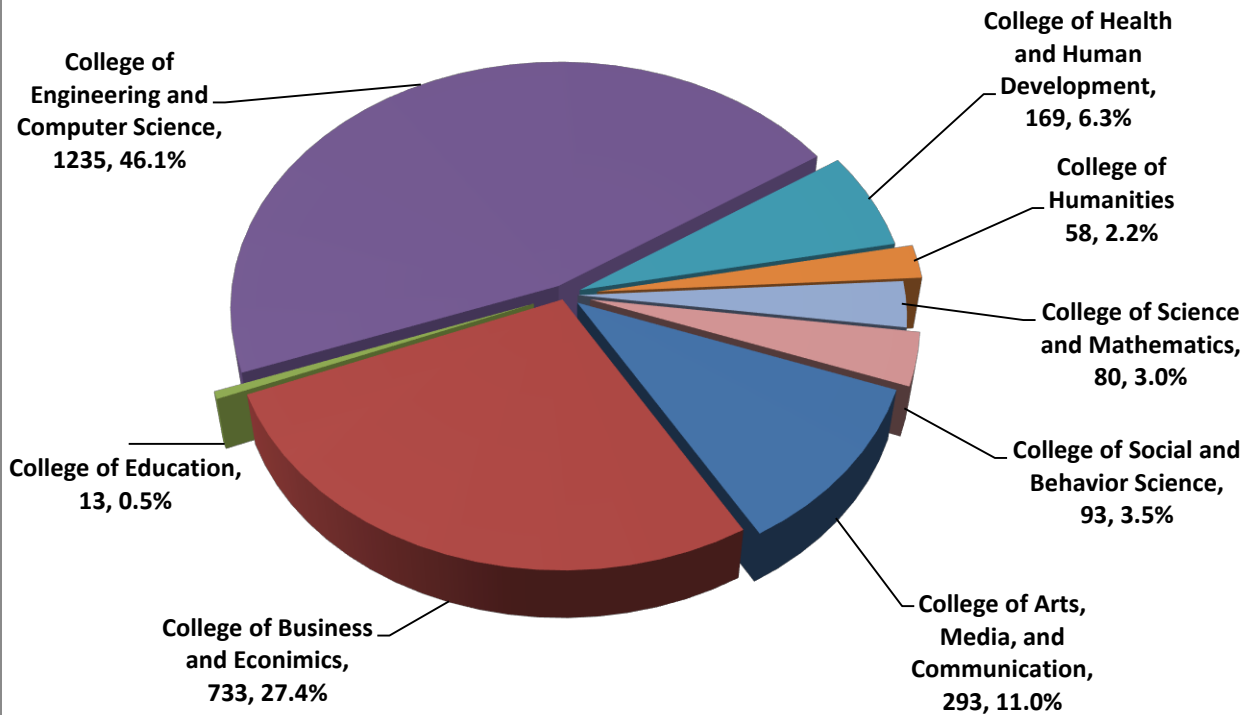
## BREAKDOWN BY REGION - FALL 2015



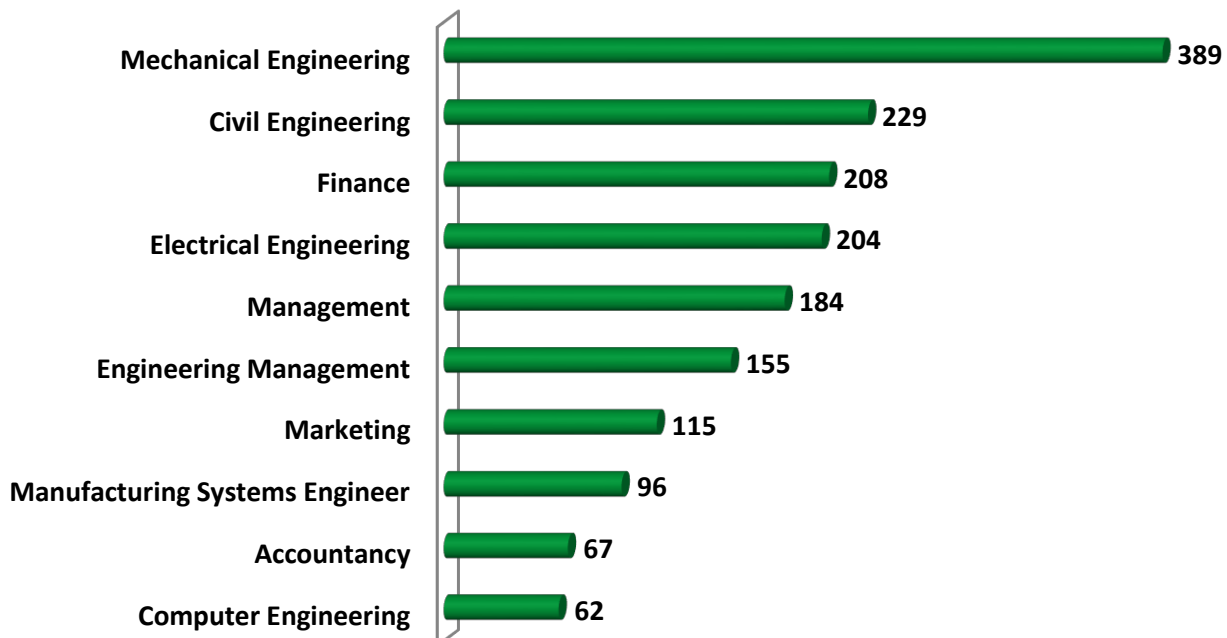
## TOP 10 COUNTRIES - FALL 2015
