#### **General Requirements for Teaching in the MFT Program at CSUN:**

- Minimum two (2) years post-license experience with a current MFT or equivalent licensure in good standing, and
- 2. Current practice as mental health provider (minimum 10+ hours per week) or substantially equivalent employment (evaluated on case-by-case basis).
- 3. Applicants must have a demonstrated ability and commitment to teaching and mentoring diverse student populations.
