Qualifications:

This course is intended for applicants to the School Psychology and School Counseling credentials and master's programs. Instructors should hold a master's or doctorate degree in Educational Psychology or related field; a teaching credential or PPS credential or at least one year of experience teaching in public schools.

EPC 500: Foundations of Elementary Teaching

EPC 420: Educational Psychology of Adolescence

These courses are intended for teacher candidates in the multiple subjects credential programs (elementary education). Instructors must hold a master's or doctorate degree in Educational Psychology or

related field; a teaching credential or at least one year of experience teaching in public elementary or middle schools.

This course is intended for teaching candidates in the single subject credential programs (secondary education). Instructors must hold a master's or doctorate degree in Educational Psychology or related field; a teaching credential or at least on year of experience teaching public secondary schools.

Academic preparation for the instruction of the courses listed above should include coursework and/or research experience in the areas of learning theory, theories of intelligence and/or cognitive development, memory, cognition, metacognition, child and adolescent development, motivation, special education and assessment. Applicants must have a demonstrated ability and commitment to teaching and mentoring a diverse student population.
