Multiple Subject Teaching Credential

- Where do I learn more about the different pathways to earning a Multiple Subject Credential?
 - Traditional Program: This program is our most flexible, and fits the needs of most candidates. Applications are accepted for both the fall and spring semesters, and can be taken full or part time. Courses are offered in the late afternoon or evening.
 - ACT (Accelerated Collaborative Teacher Preparation Program): This program allows students to earn their credential in two semesters. Applications are only accepted in Fall semesters. Student in this pathway receive a cohort atmosphere with personalized advising and guaranteed course enrollment.
 - ITEP (Integrated Teacher Education Program):
 - Freshman Option: This pathway leads to a bachelor's degree in Liberal Studies and a Multiple Subject Credential concurrently. This full time cohorted program is designed for first time freshman students.
 Applications are only accepted in Fall semesters.
 - Junior Option: This pathway leads to a bachelor's degree in Liberal Studies and a Multiple Subject Credential concurrently, for those student with junior standing. Designed to be taken full or part time, applications are accepted in both Fall and Spring semesters.
 - Internship Program: This program is designed for students with an offer of full time employment in a public or charter elementary position. Classes are offered in the late afternoon and evening and certain coursework can be completed on the job.
