Linda expressed that the Psychology Department is special to them both academically and personally. They are not only grateful for the excellent instruction they received from the psychology faculty when completing their master's degrees in psychology, but the two met, fell in love, and married shortly after finishing their graduate work in their psychology programs.

Charlie went on to receive his Ph.D. in Cognitive/Mathematical Psychology at UCLA. Upon completion, he accepted a faculty position at Florida State University's College of Business, where he has been a Marketing professor since 1985. He has earned numerous accolades and accomplishments, including being voted educator of the year by the Marketing Edge

IN MEMORIAM



It is with great sadness that the department announces the passing of a great professor, respected colleague, and dear friend, **Dr. Luciana Laganà**. Dr. Laganà was born and raised in Italy, were she graduated with a psychology degree from the University of Rome. She then moved to the United States and obtained two doctoral degrees, one in Cognitive Psychology from the University of Georgia and a second in Clinical Psychology at the

Illinois Institute of Technology. After a research postdoctoral fellowship at Stanford University School of Medicine, she was hired at CSUN as a psychology professor where she taught courses in the areas of gerontology and human sexuality as well as conducted aging research for two decades.

While at CSUN, Dr. Laganà had a very active research lab where she delighted in training undergraduate and graduate students, many of whom went on to obtain doctoral degrees in the field of psychology. She also secured funding from the National Institutes of Health to conduct her research. She retired from CSUN at the end of fall 2021.

During her time at CSUN she also pursued her interests in acting, directing and screenwriting. Dr. Laganà is survived by her husband of 20 years, Greg Graham. She will be missed by her many students, colleagues and friends.

The Psychology Department plans to hold a memorial in honor of Dr. Laganà and will provide more information as it becomes available.
