I. Call to Order

The meeting was called to order at 2:01 pm.

F. Credit for Prior Learning Policy

The committee discussed the Credit for Prior Learning policy recommendation EPC approved on February 21, 2024. Some members were concerned with alternating between "assessment" and "exam" and clarifying how many units may be applied to various degree programs to align with other transfer credit policies. The GSC will review the policy recommendation for a second reading at the next meeting.

G. Policy Recommendations from Extended Learning Committee

After brief discussion, the Enrollment of Non-Matriculated Students in CSUN State-Supported and CSUN Self-Supported Special Session Courses policy recommendation was **MSP approved** with minor revisions. The committee reviewed but did not need to approve the Advancing Student Achievement Program since it is not a policy recommendation.

VI. Program Review Updates

C. terHorst attended the final MOU meeting for Cinema and Television Arts. He reported that the department received 11 commendations and 11 recommendations. He also stated that one of the recommendations was that the department consider becoming a film school to attract additional resources.

A. Hollett attended the final MOU exit meeting for Educational Therapy, M.A. and Special Education, M.A. She reported that both programs were commended for their clear commitment to diversity, equity, and inclusion and for their robust process of assessment practices for continuous improvement and student success. The reviewers recommended that the department should consider expanding its assessment process to maintain consistent relationships with alumni and find ways to encourage students to present their research findings on campus.

VII. Discussion Items

- D. Spratt shared that she consulted with D. Weingarten on what EPC is doing about second disqualifications at the undergraduate level. Like GSC, EPC would like to change the second disqualification policy since it currently serves a limited number of students and has been used as a mechanism to deal with student issues. Spratt and Weingarten will research what other campuses are doing to find helpful policy models. Spratt stated that she will continue the discussion at the next meeting.
- D. Spratt asked members whether the start time for GSC meetings needed to be adjusted because of the updated class meeting patterns starting in Fall 2024. The committee agreed to continue with the existing meeting time for the 2024-25 academic year. Spratt will inform the Faculty Senate Office of the meeting time.
