Annually, **HEALTHY START** coordinates the donation, delivery and distribution of over 1,500 Thanksgiving dinners, 1,000s of Christmas meals and presents and Christmas trees. In addition, in 2013-2014 **HEALTHY START** assisted 2,765 uninsured students and family members apply for health insurance coverage.

What is Healthy Start?

Healthy Start is designed to serve children, youth, their family members, and the community. The program provides comprehensive school-integrated services and activities to meet the desired results identified in the areas of academics, family support, basic needs, and physical and mental health care, and health insurance enrollment. By coordinating integrated service delivery through community partnerships, Healthy Start connects children and families to needed support and services designed to:

- Ensure that students receive the physical, emotional, and intellectual support needed.
- Build the capacity of students and parents to be participants, leaders, and decision makers in their communities.
- Help schools, other child, and family-serving agencies integrate their programs to provide more effective support to schools, children and their families.

Healthy Start Employee Honored for Going Above, Beyond

- Tushana Howard, Student & Family Resources Navigator at Narbonne Senior High, was award the Heroes in Education Award by LAUSD Board President Dr. Richard Vladovic for, in part, "assist students and their families with locating resources they need to help them be successful in school." In addition, the award noted her strong personal relationships often prevented potential problems because early assistance was sought.
- Blanca Espinoza, Healthy Start Wellness Coordinator for the Garfield/Roosevelt areas started a meal distribution program for 125 families a week at Eastman EL with the support of the Principal. In 2014-2015, the program, which is financially sponsored by the Southern Regional Food Bank, expanded to Hooper EL, another Healthy Start School. Annually, this means 37,500 meals are provided at each school during the school year for a total of 75,000 meals. LA Community Hospital provides nutrition education to parents receiving the support.
