Hossein Hafezian received his PhD in political science from the University of Tehran in 2004. He has written extensively on women's issues, development, and Middle East politics in various Persian, English and Arabic journals, including *Women and the Revolution: The Untold Story* in 2001 concerning the role Iranian women played in the process of Iranian 1979 Islamic Revolution. He has also co-authored a book on the *Role of Women in the Muslim Countries' Development* published by Tehran University Press in March 2007. Since 2000, he has worked as a senior research fellow at the Center for Middle East Strategic Studies. He is the assistant editor of *Discourse: An Iranian Quarterly*, and a member of the editorial staff of *Middle East Studies Quarterly*, both published by the Center. He has published *State, Elites and Development in the Middle East* by the Center for Strategic Research in 2009. He is a member of the board of directors and treasurer of the Iranian Association of Women's Studies since 2005 and has chaired the Department of Political Science in the Islamic Azad University at Karaj from 2006-2010. He is currently a visiting professor at the Department of Political Science and Law at Montclair State University in New Jersey.
