

The Essie Elliott Scholarship - \$1500

Any FCS full-time undergraduate students at a 4-year institution in the LA area, with a major in Family and Consumer Sciences.

To be awarded for 2023-2024 academic year

ELIGIBILITY: Family and Consumer Sciences students who are currently active members of the American Association of Family and Consumer Sciences and the California Association of Family and Consumer Sciences. Any full-time undergraduate students at a 4-year institution in the LA area, in Family and Consumer Sciences, Home Economics, or a related field. The student must be taking a minimum of 12 units a semester or quarter. An applicant must have a 3.0 or above cumulative grade point average (may use Community College or High School grades if appropriate; scholarship only awarded if student is accepted and enrolled). Preference will be given to applicants to have been actively involved in AAFCS.

APPLICATION PROCEDURE: All of the following items must be sent in a 9" x 12" envelope to the Chair of the Scholarship Committee postmarked no later than:

March 17, 2023

1. A current resume.
2. A statement from the applicant including (not to exceed 300 words):
 - a. motivating influences for selecting Family and Consumer Sciences as your area of study
 - b. professional aspirations in your proposed area of study
 - c. student, professional, and/or community involvement
 - d. need for financial assistance
3. Two letters of recommendation, each signed in a sealed envelope, at least one of which must be from a college professor or administrator (or teacher) and one from an AAFCS member (or one letter from professor/ administrator who is an AAFCS member).

Letters should include:

- a. how long and in what capacity the writer has known the applicant
 - b. the writer's evaluation of the applicant on the following points: leadership ability, intellectual interests, maturity, character, potential for success, and any additional pertinent comments
 - c. the faculty recommendation must include comments on potential contributions of the applicant to the Family and Consumer Sciences profession
4. Current official transcript of records from each college/university (or high school if appropriate) attended.
 5. A copy of the applicant's current AAFCS membership card. **The LA District will pay \$25.00 of the \$50.00 membership for first-time members. Include your application (from the AAFCS website www.aafcs.org) and check for \$25.00 made payable to "AAFCS."**

\$1000 GRADUATE FELLOWSHIP

IN FAMILY AND CONSUMER SCIENCES

To be awarded for 2023-2024 academic year

ELIGIBILITY: Professionals in Family and Consumer Sciences who are currently active members of the American Association of Family and Consumer Sciences and the California Association of Family and Consumer Sciences who either reside or are enrolled in a program in the LA District area. Graduate students who will be or are enrolled in graduate level courses either full-time or part-time in an accredited graduate program in Family and Consumer Sciences, Home Economics, or a related field. The student must be taking a minimum of six units a semester or quarter. An applicant must have a 3.0 or above cumulative grade point average. Preference will be given to applicants to have been actively involved in AAFCS.

APPLICATION PROCEDURE: All of the following items must be sent in a 9" x 12" envelope to the Chair of the Scholarship Committee postmarked no later than: **March 17, 2023.**

1. A current resume.
2. A statement from the applicant including (not to exceed 300 words):
 - a. motivating influences for selecting Family and Consumer Sciences as your area of study
 - b. professional aspirations in your proposed area of graduate study
 - c. student, professional, and/or community involvement
 - d. need for financial assistance
