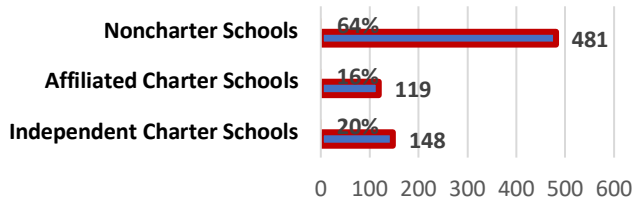


## Featuring the Los Angeles Unified School District (LAUSD) Partnership

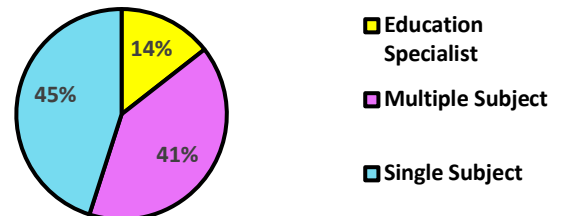
### Did You Know That...

In 2022-23, 200 LAUSD schools, including affiliated and independent charter schools, provided 748 field assignments for credential candidates: 481 (64%) in noncharter schools, 119 (16%) in affiliated charters, and 148 (20%) in independent charters. Of the field placements, 303 (41%) were in elementary education, 337 (45%) in secondary education, and 108 (14%) in special education. Candidates participated in five credential pathways, with the majority (613, 82%) in three post-BA options: Traditional (part- or full-time self-paced with flexible scheduling), ACT (1-year full-time residency), and Intern (restricted to teachers of record on a temporary license). Candidates also participated in two undergraduate pathways (18%): Freshman (FYI) or Junior (JYI) secondary education option, and ITEP (Integrated Teacher Education Program) elementary education option).

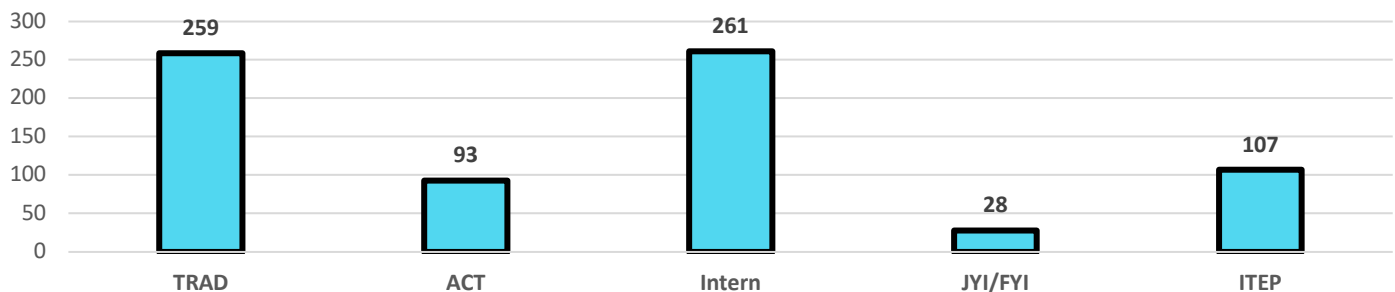
**Number and Percentage of Placements by School Designation**
