3. Individuals are included in each time period if they have *no more than two (2)* consecutive quarters without earnings in that time period.

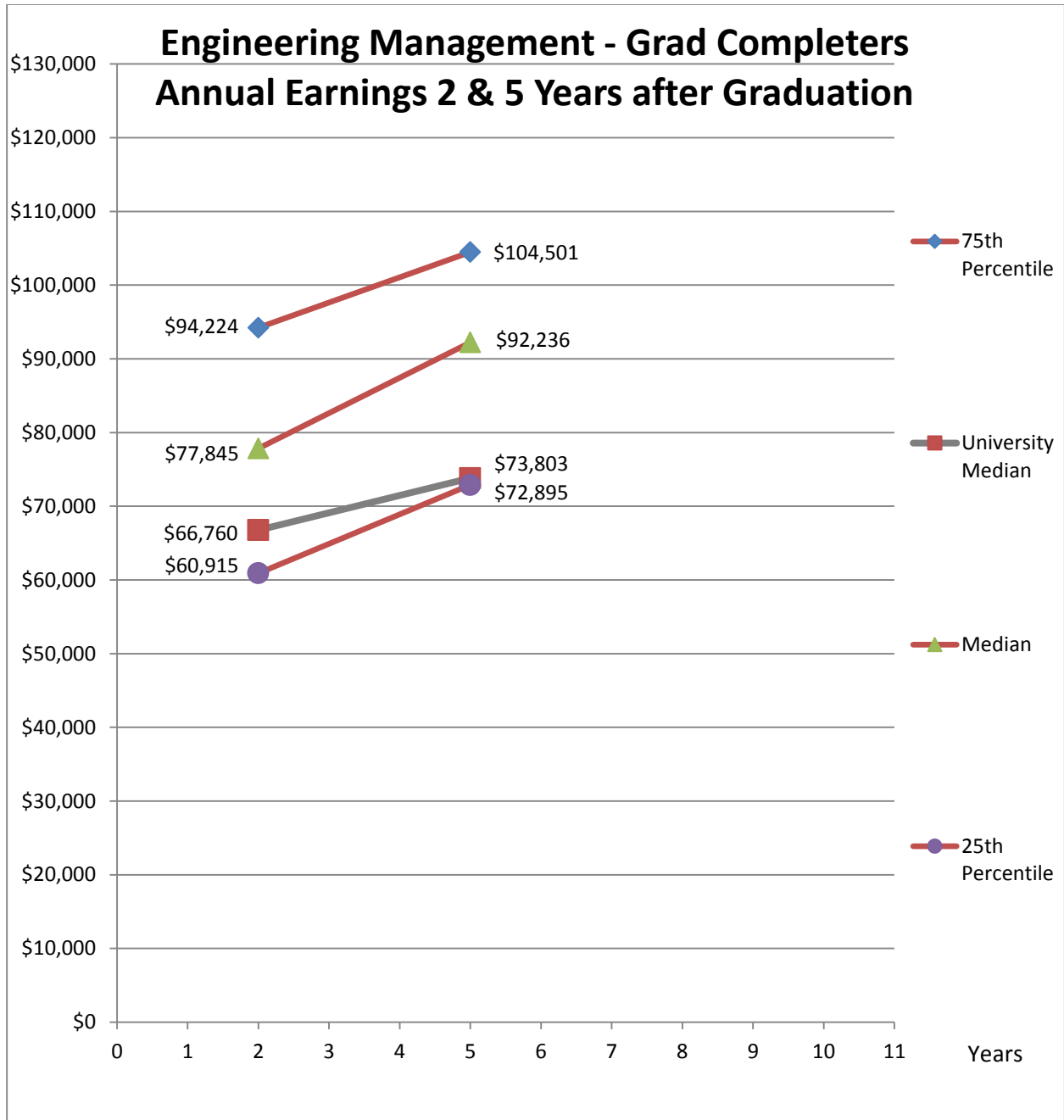
