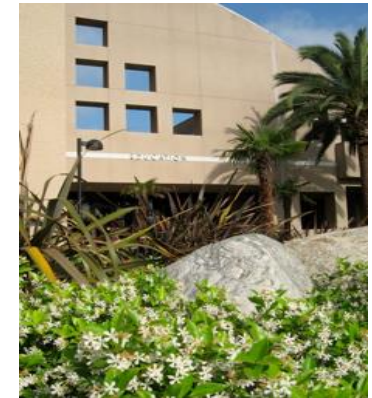

This program is for persons who have a Bachelor's degree in any subject area and want to become elementary school teachers.

Why Choose the Traditional Program?

Field and Student Teaching Experiences in the Program

E ED 520 Teaching Reading in the Elementary School

20 hours of observation/participation in public elementary school classrooms. Provides opportunities to see literacy instruction in action.

E ED 560C Supervised Fieldwork

20 hours of early field experience in a public school, followed by one-half day (Monday through Friday mornings) field experience for 10 weeks.

E ED 561F Student Teaching

20 hours of early field experience in a public school, followed by an all day (Monday through Friday) student teaching experience for 10 weeks.
