Field Education Internships: Field practicum is the signature pedagogy in graduate social work education. It is in field education where theory, practice concepts, and skills, values, and social policy and research information are applied and internalized. Field education provides the guided practice needed to prepare MSW students to become advanced social work professionals.

Tuition Rates and Other Cohort Differences: Applicants may be interested in more than one cohort at the time of application. On-campus (state-support) and online/off-campus (self-support) cohorts may differ by tuition cost, eligibility for various types of financial aid and grants, and/or eligibility for other types of resources and services (ie. limited stipend opportunities that have specific eligibility criteria). If offered admission to the program, it is the applicant's responsibility to clarify which type of aid, resources, and services they may be eligible for based upon their cohort choice prior to joining the program.
