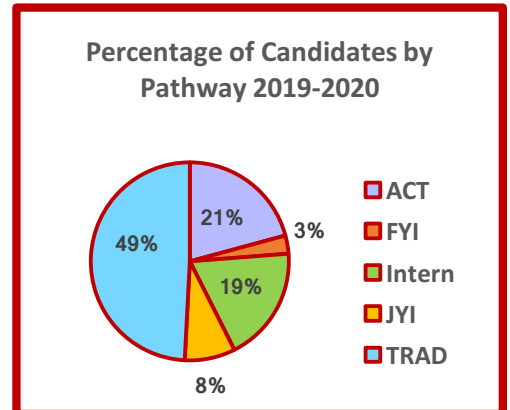
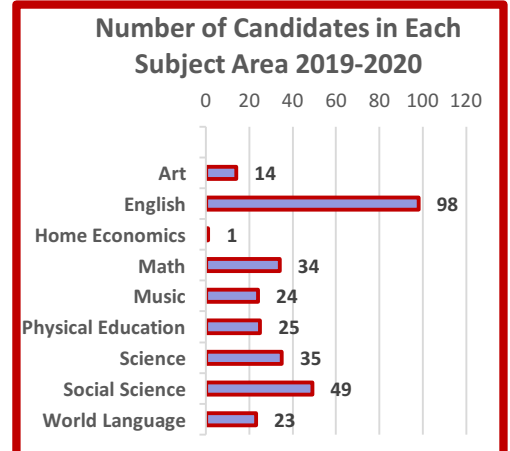
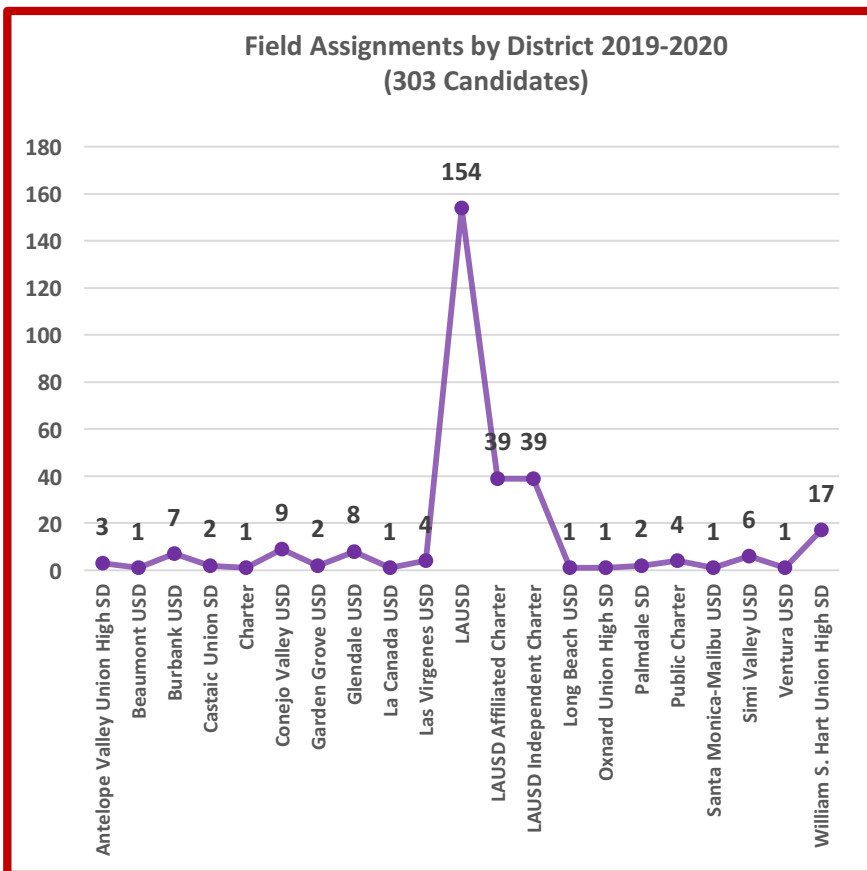

Featuring the Secondary Education Credential Program

Did You Know That...

The Department of Secondary Education placed 303 credential candidates in field assignments during the 2019-2020 academic year (156 in Fall 2019 and 147 in Spring 2020). These candidates, interested in teaching in a variety of subject areas, participated in five credential pathways: part- or full-time Traditional (TRAD) program, 1-year full-time cohort-based Accelerated Collaborative Teacher (ACT) Program, 2-year Intern Program for on-the-job teachers, and the Undergraduate 4-year (FYI) or 2-year (JYI) Integrated Program.
