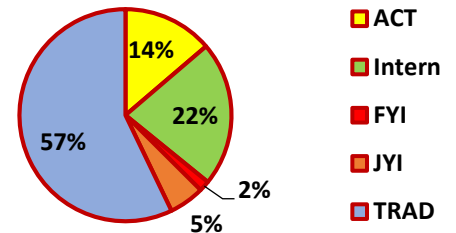


Featuring the Secondary Education Credential Program

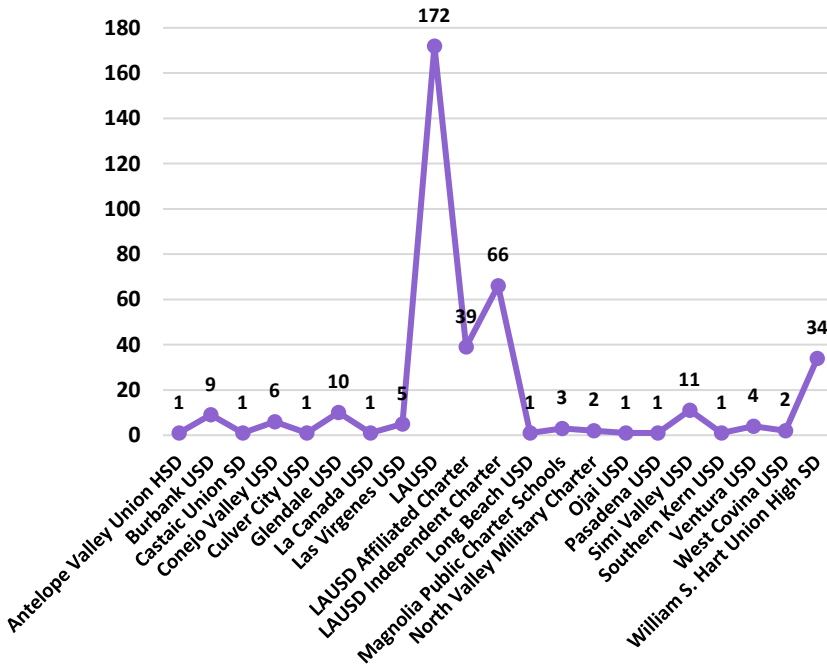
Did You Know That...

The Department of Secondary Education placed 371 credential candidates in field assignments during the 2018-2019 academic year (195 in Fall 2018 and 176 in Spring 2019). These candidates participated in five credential pathways: part- or full-time traditional (TRAD) program, 1-year full-time cohort-based Accelerated Collaborative Teacher (ACT) Program, 2-year Intern Program for on-the-job teachers, Undergraduate 4-year (FYI) or 2-year (JYI) Integrated Program.

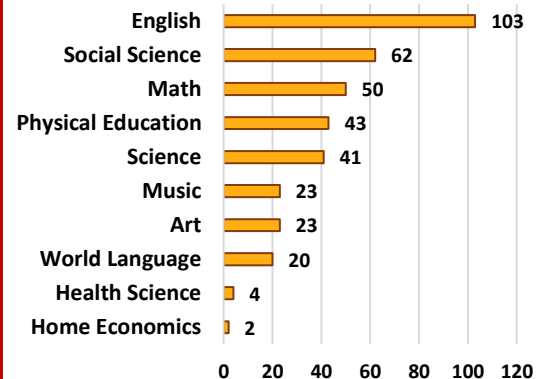
Percentage of Candidates by Pathway 2018-2019
