To meet the needs of our students there are many College and Department-based tutoring centers for discipline-based support and University-based tutoring (for multi-subject)



STEPS TO ACADEMIC SUCCESS | Important Dates

Make sure to register on the date of your assigned registration or soon after. You are eligible to register after your date; however, classes might get full.

- GOOD STANDING: Students can enroll in a maximum of 17 units (19 for graduating seniors). Maximum unit limit for students on academic notice is 13 units.
- <u>CLOSED CLASSES</u>: Students can add to the waitlist after their registration date and time until the end of the first week of classes (maximum 13 units).
- **REPEATING COURSES:** Can be added <u>AFTER</u> your assigned registration period (see below for permitted date).

_	Now – Jan 21st		Non-restrictive registration period, No appointment required

_	Jan 22 nd		Weekday classes begin	
_	Jan 22 nd – Jan 28 th	(week 1)	Add/drop/swap/change grading classes available online	
_	Jan 29 th – Feb 16 th	(weeks 2-4)	Permission is required to add all classes; wait listing is not available.	
_	Feb 16 th	(end of week 4)	Last day to drop/withdrawal or change grading basis in SOLAR	

Note: October 1st, 2023 – March 2nd, 2024 is the annual priority filing deadline for the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) and California Dream Act applications. To be eligible for financial aid funds in the upcoming academic year (2024-2025), you must apply by March 2 of the current academic year.
