Dr. Mather is a co-author of the Woodcock-Johnson IV and has co-authored two books on interpretation and application of the WJ IV. Her most recent book on dyslexia is: *Essentials of Dyslexia: Assessment and Intervention* (Mather & Wendling, 2012) and on learning disabilities: *Learning Disabilities and Challenging Behaviors* (Mather, Goldstein, & Eklund, 2015).
