



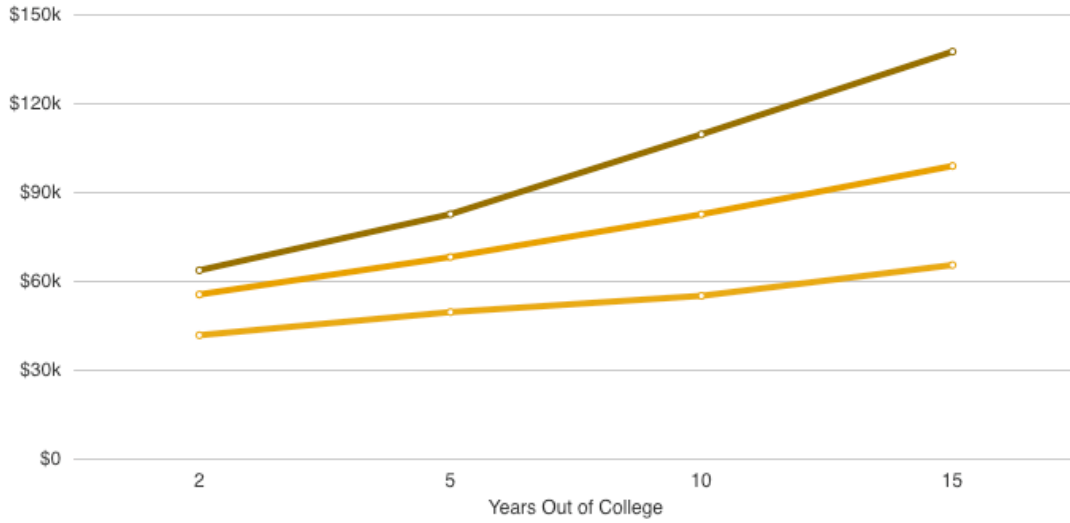
Undergraduate Earnings by Major

Notes

- Only students who remained in California, and whose earnings were covered by Unemployment Insurance at 2, 5, and 10 years after education exit are included in the study. As a result, students who have moved out of state or are out of the labor market are excluded, as are those in the military, federal employment, or self-employed. Further, the study population was limited to students who, in any given period, had no more than two (2) consecutive quarters without reported earnings. You can view a copy of the All University Earnings Data report (.pdf), which includes the percentage of students found during the study.
- Earnings are reported for California workers whose earnings are covered by Unemployment Insurance at 2, 5, and 10 years after education exit. As a result, students who have moved out of state or are out of the labor market are excluded, as are those in the military, federal employment, or self-employed.
- Individuals who have more than two (2) consecutive quarters without earnings in a given time period are excluded from consideration.
- Earnings are adjusted to 2016 dollars for inflation.

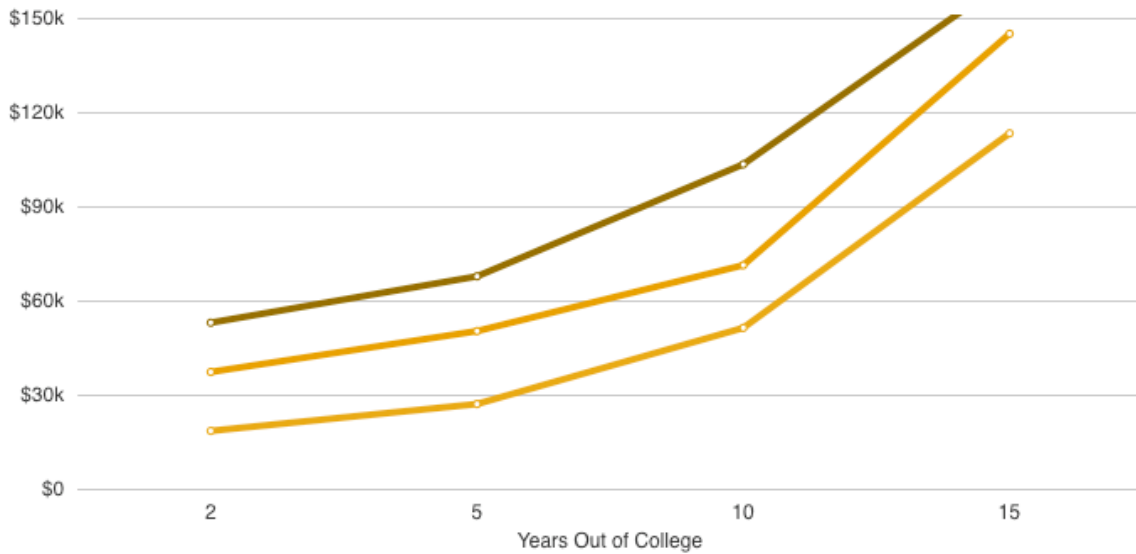

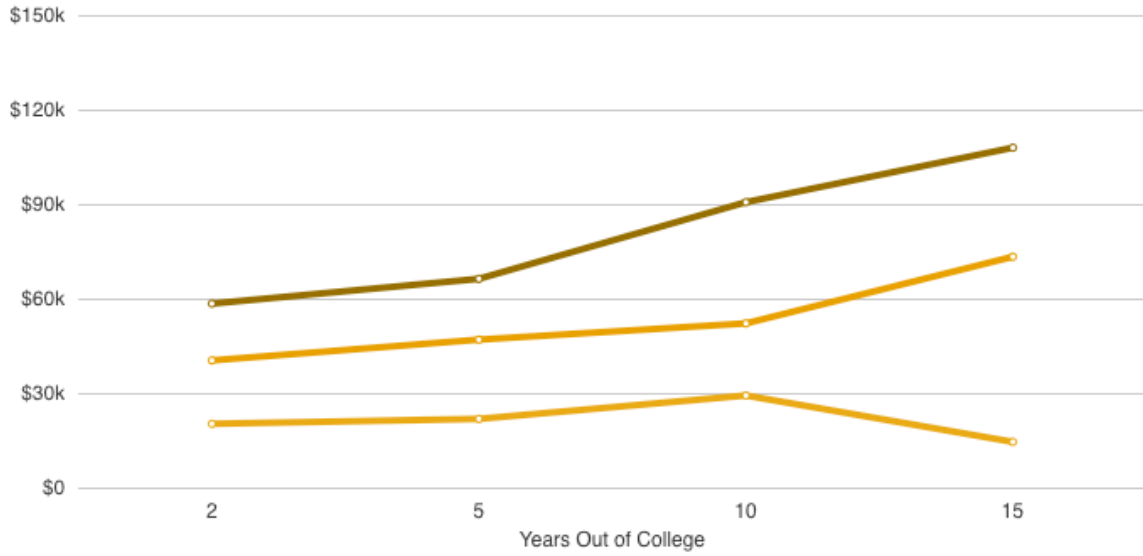

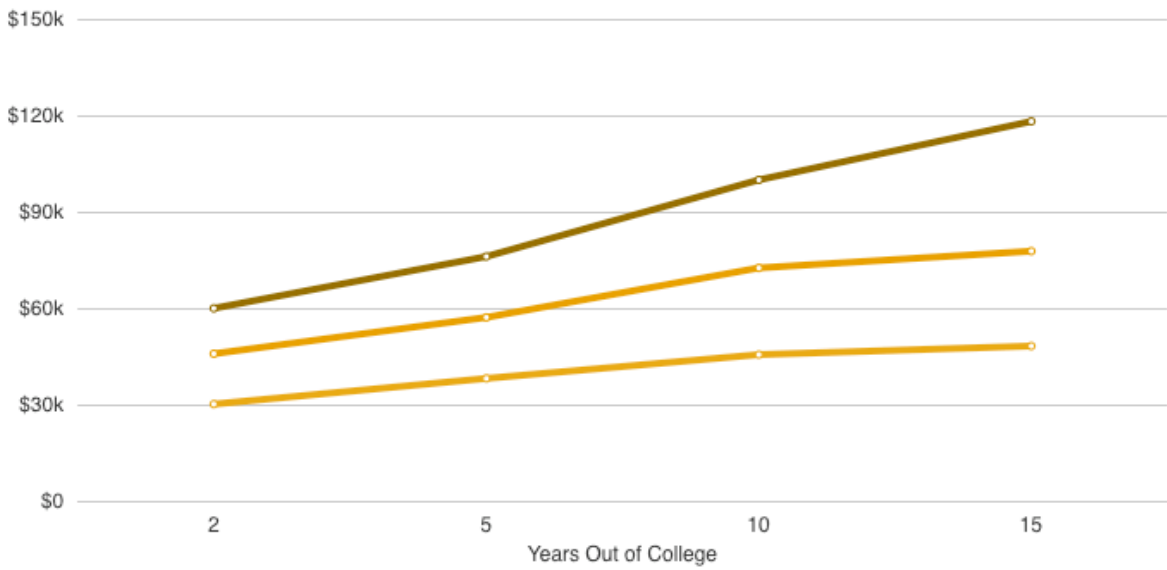

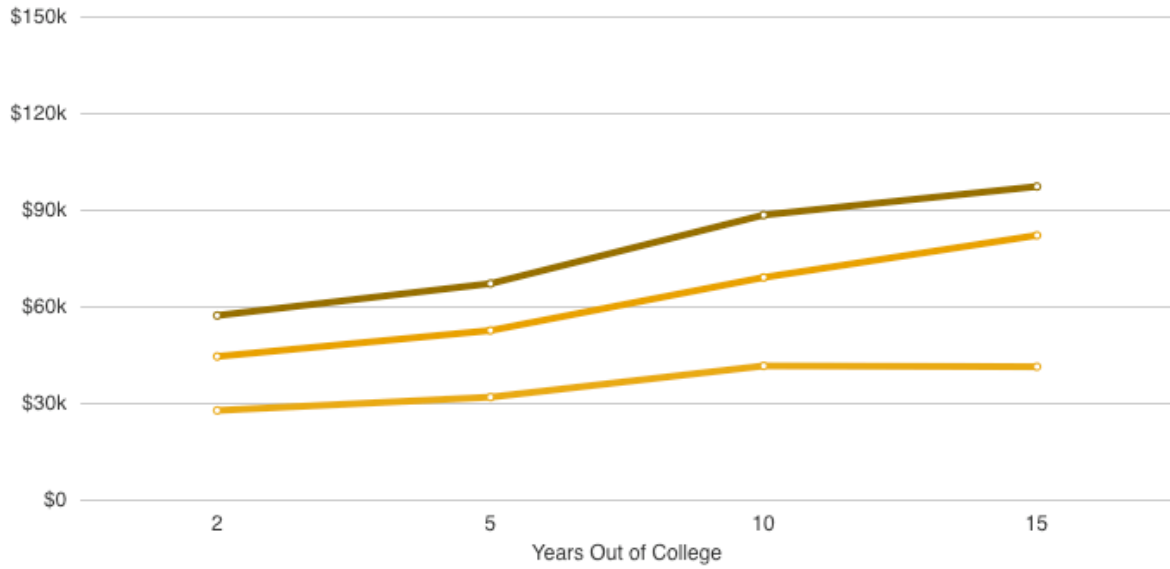

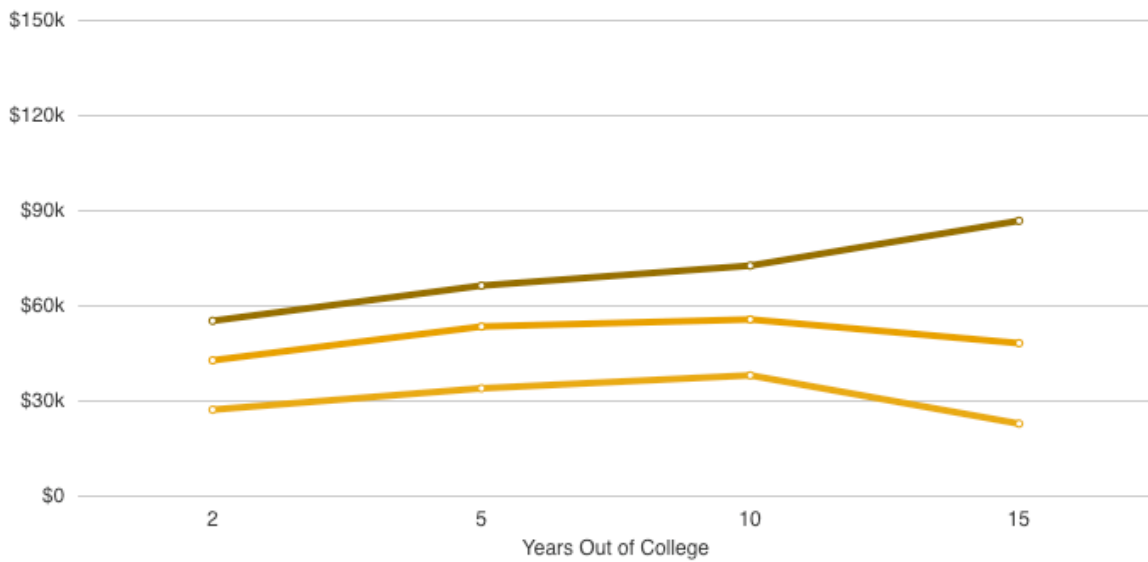

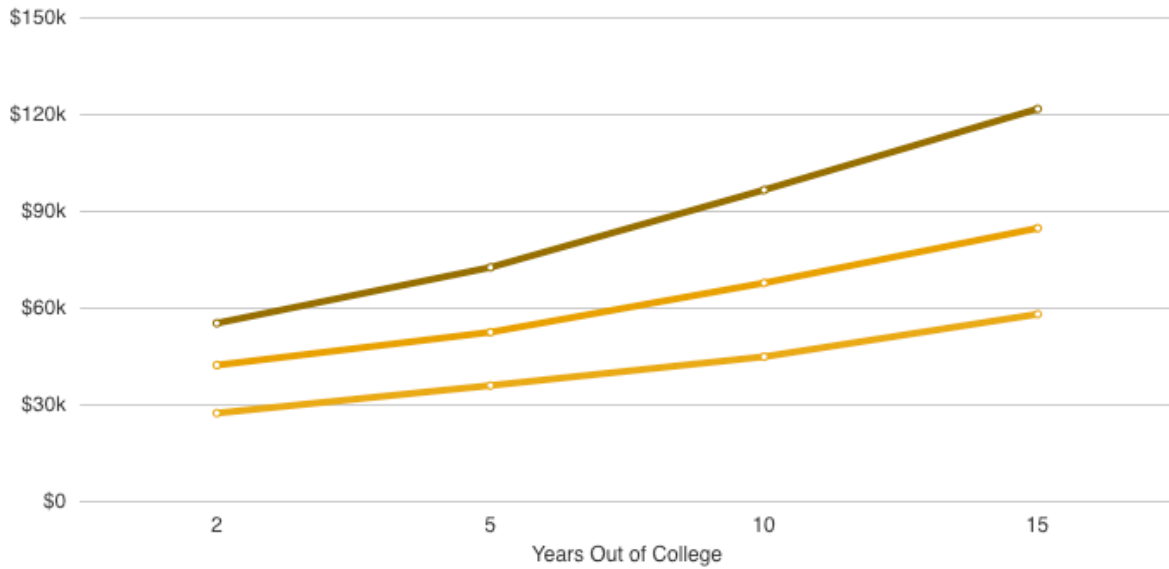

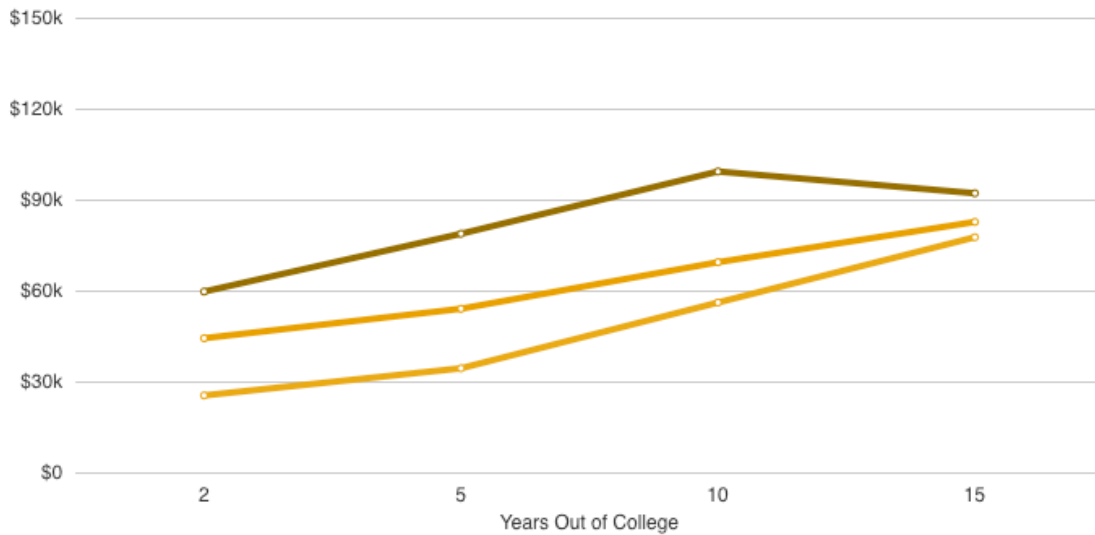
