BICYCLE THEFTS

DATE TIME: Between Friday, September 7, 2017 and Tuesday, September 12 2017 at various times between the hours of 08:00 a.m. and 10:00 p.m.

LOCATIONS: Campus-wide outdoor bike racks.

REPORTED OFFENSE: Six (6) bicycle thefts were reported during the dates/times noted above. **None were stolen from within a bicycle compound.** All six were secured with a cable type lock. **None were secured with U-locks.**

Matador Bicycle Compound

It's FREE, enclosed with card access and CCTV security, and more secure than stand-alone bike racks & easy to use. Compounds are located on the 1st levels of the B3, B5 & G3 structures and near UP 11 & 15.



Bicycle Registration

Make your bicycle a hard target

No lock is 100% theft-proof but hardened steel **U-locks** have proven to be much tougher when compared to cable locks. If possible, secure the front tire & frame to the bicycle rack. Never lock JUST the front tire.
