


CSU Fully Online Courses at California State University, Northridge

You are a student at CSUN and held to CSUN policies and deadlines. You have a CSUN student ID number and access to the CSUN Portal, your <u>CSUN Gmail</u> account, the <u>CSUN Mobile App</u> and more.

- Set up your portal and email access. Visit <u>Activate Your CSUN Account</u> or <u>CSUN Portal Login</u>.
- Select MyCSUN at <u>https://www.csun.edu</u> to reveal the login panel pictured below. Use the same CSUN user ID and password to log in to the portal, CSUN Gmail, Canvas, Zoom, etc.

Spring 2024 Key Dates at CSUN

Follow these dates from CSUN's <u>Registration Calendar</u>:

- Fri.-Sat. and Sat.-only classes begin Jan. 20, 2024. Weekday classes begin Mon., Jan. 22.
- Last day to drop a class online using self-service registration: Fri., Feb. 16.*
- Last day of formal instruction: Fri., May 10.
- Final exams week: Sat. through Fri., May 11 to 17. Grades are available starting: May 11.
- Holidays : Mon., April 1 (César Chávez Day) and Mon., May 27 (Memorial Day Observed).

*To **DROP** your CSU Fully Online course after enrolling, take these steps to **avoid a failing grade**:

- On or before Feb. 16, 2024, drop online in self-service registration. Visit the Drop a Class Guide.
- After Feb. 16, formal approval and form(s) are required. Visit Late Schedule Changes.

Grades, Academic Standing & Transcripts

- When the CSUN fully online course ends, your **grade** will be reported automatically to your home CSU and posted as transfer credit. If you do not drop your CSUN class by the deadline on page 1 or <u>request</u> <u>formal approval to drop after the deadline</u>, you will receive <u>a grade of WU</u> (unauthorized withdrawal), which will count as an F. So be sure to officially drop the class.
- Your **academic standing** at CSUN will also count. If you receive a D, F, or WU grade at CSUN, you could be put on <u>academic notice</u> or become disqualified even if you remain in good standing at your home CSU. Academic notice or disqualification will become part of your permanent academic record.
- As a student at CSUN, you will need to <u>order CSUN transcripts</u> from us for any future academic endeavors (transferring or graduate school).
