All ceremonies will take place at the University Library Lawn. Each program is expected to run approximately 2 hours. The ceremony will allow the reading of the attending graduates' names. The executive officers of the University will be in attendance at each ceremony to offer congratulations.

NOTE: Students participating in Commencement must attend the ceremony for their own College. As guests, students may attend ceremonies for other Colleges, but will require tickets.

PREPARING FOR COMMENCEMENT

PARTICIPATION IN CEREMONY

Students who may participate in the 2023 Commencement Ceremony are those who have earned their degrees at the conclusion of the Fall 2022 Semester, and those who expect to earn their degrees at the conclusion of the Spring 2023 or Summer 2023 semesters. Candidates must have submitted an application to the Office of Admissions and Records by March 3rd, 2023. Failure of this submission may result in not being eligible to participate in the 2023 Commencement Ceremony.

Undergraduates can verify if they have successfully applied to graduate by contacting Undergraduate Degree Services at (818) 677 - 3781.

Graduate Students can verify if they have successfully applied to graduate by contacting Graduate Studies at (818) 677 - 4800.

Students who expect to complete their coursework during the 2023-2024 academic year are not permitted to participate in the 2023 Commencement.

RECORD YOUR NAME

Do you want to your name pronounced correctly when you cross the stage?

We are working with the company "Marching Order" to provide us a professional way to both see and hear your name as it is called out during your ceremony. Each graduate's name will be pre-recorded and played as they cross the stage. Please follow the instructions below:

- Log into your Marching Order account by visiting https://csun.marchingorder.com/#/
- 2. Complete your ceremony registration
- 3. Name Recording click how you would like to record your name
- 4. Follow the instructions to record your name, or provide a phonetic spelling of your name.

You must have your name recorded by April 14th to have it apply to this year's ceremonies.

PLEASE NOTE: An email with details on how to create your Marching Order account will sent to your CSUN email during the first week of March.

CSUN STUDENT SPEAKER AT COMMENEMCEMENT

CSUN invites students from the graduating class to apply to be the student commencement speaker. It is a distinguished honor to be selected to present a commencement speech—to share your experience, inspire your fellow graduates, and encourage excitement about their future adventures.

Student Speaker Criteria:

- Filed an application to graduate for the current academic year (Fall 2021, Spring 2022, and Summer 2022)
- Minimum 3.0 GPA
- · Embodies the spirit of the graduating class and represents CSUN
- Possesses strong public speaking skills
- Student Speeches should be 2 to 3 minutes in length.

Student speakers will be asked to work with a representative from the office of Student Development and Transitional Programs in the weeks leading up to commencement to ensure their preparation. Selected students may be asked to refine their speech and practice their delivery in accordance with the Committee's guidance. Students will be selected by a committee from each college and all applicants will be notified by Friday April 22nd of their status in the process.

COMMENCEMENT TICKETING

Graduates should become familiar with the following information on this year's ticketing process:

- All guests of graduates will be required to possess a ticket in order to gain admission to the University Library Lawn Venue.
- Graduates (and participating faculty) will not need a ticket for admittance to the ceremony at which their degrees are being conferred.
- A personalized online ticket account will be provided to all eligible participants.
- Information on how to get access to this account will be sent to your CSUN email.
- Guest tickets will be free of charge.
- Graduates must claim their tickets by April 15th. All unclaimed tickets will be removed from a graduates' account.
- Children who do not take up a seat and will remain seated in a person's lap throughout the entire ceremony will not require a ticket into the venue.
- · Tickets will be scanned at the entrance of the ceremony venue.
- Graduates have the responsibility to give their tickets to their respective guests prior to the ceremony.

Students that have double or multiple majors that span across different ceremonies (i.e. Political Science and Economics) will have tickets provided for each ceremony that their degrees are conferred. Students with double or multiple majors that fall within the same ceremony (i.e. Philosophy and Religious Studies), will be provided with tickets to the single ceremony where their degree is conferred.

All guest seating is General Admission and on a first come, first serve basis. We would encourage your guests to arrive one hour and thirty minutes prior to the ceremony.

*NOTE: Electronic tickets are generated with a unique barcode that is traceable back to the student who requested them. Due to this security feature your tickets may be reprinted, however, reprinting tickets invalidates any perviously printed tickets. Duplicate tickets with the same bar code will be denied at the enterance of the venue. Any attempt to sell or make multiple copies of electronic tickets would be considered a misuse of CSUN property. This may result in the voilation being reported to the Dean of Students, which may include disciplinary action.

GRADUATE LINE-UP

In order to check-in, graduates should arrive robed and ready to line-up for the processional at least 2 hours before the ceremony is set to begin. At the Commencement ceremony, graduates will need to picke their official name card prior to entering the venue. YOU MUST HAVE A NAME CARD IN ORDER TO PARTICIPATE IN YOUR CEREMONY. Name cards will be distributed by last name on the CSUN Campus Store Lawn which is adjacent to the graduate enterance. If cards become available prior to your ceremony, we will notify you by CSUN email.

Students must retain the official name card until collected by the name reader during the ceremony near the stage.

The graduate check-in area for the Commencement Ceremonies will be on the lawn outside the CSUN Campus Store. If a graduate should arrive late for any reason they would still check in at the South end of Sierra Quad and staff will assist them to their seat.

Look for the directional signs to the graduate check-in. Faculty and staff from your college will be supervising the line-up procedure for the processional. Please follow their instructions.

GRADUATE BEHAVIOR

Commencement is a dignified occassion. Participants are expected to conduct themselves accordingly. Graduates and families look forward to this milestone with excitement and anticipation. Students and guest are expected to remain seated until the ceremony has concluded.

Alcoholic beverages are strictly prohibited. Any alcoholic beverages discovered on the premises will be confiscated. Any graduate or guest obviously intoxicated or under the influence of a controlled substance will be removed from the Commencement site and potentially subject to arrest.



HONORS

University Academic Honors

To receive University Honors upon graduation, an *undergraduate* student must:

- Complete a minimum of 45 units of work in letter-graded courses in this University.
- Earn a grade point average (GPA) of 3.50 or above in all work taken at CSUN and cumulatively (transfer and CSUN work).

The level of honors is based on the grade point average in all undergraduate courses, including transfer work (cumulative).

The level of honors is determined as follows:

- Summa Cum Laude GPA of 3.90 or above
- Magna Cum Laude GPA of 3.75 to 3.89
- Cum Laude GPA of 3.50 to 3.75

If University Honors is awarded when the degree is granted, honors will be reflected on your diploma and your CSUN transcript.

Graduate Students are not awarded with "University Honors" but, rather recognized on their diploma and graduating "With Distinction" upon receiving a 3.885 GPA or higher within their graduate level courses.

University Honors paraphernalia may be purchased at the CSUN Campus Store and may be worn over regalia at the Commencement Ceremony.



CSUN HONORS CONVOCATION

Each year CSUN recognizes outstanding undergraduate and graduate degree recipients by inviting them to participate in the Honors Convocation ceremony. Students meeting the established criteria will receive an official invitation to the ceremony in April. In addition, each student will have their name and award included in a souvenir program, and will be invested with a Medallion at the Convocation ceremony.

Participation in the Annual Honors Convocation is limited to undergraduate and graduate students who have received or are candidates for a degree in Fall 2022. Spring 2023, and Summer 2023. Students receiving a credential or certificate are not eligible for this recognition. Students may participate in Honors Convocation no more than one for each undergraduate or graduate degree earned. Students become eligible for participation in Honors Convocation based on meeting one of the following criteria:

Scholastic Recognition

All graduating seniors (Fall 2022, Spring 20233, and Summer 2023) with a cumulative grad point average (GPA) of 3.50 or better as of Fall 2022 are eligible for recognition.

All graduating masters students within this same time holding a cumulative GPA of 3.885 or better as of Fall 2022 are also eligible for recognition.

Students who successfully apply for graduation and meet the GPA requirements listed above should automatically receive an invitation to the ceremony by the University President.

Personal Recognition and Nominations

All graduating students (undergraduate and graduate degree recipients for Fall 2022, Spring 2023, and Summer 2023) who are recipients of a department, college or University award, or scholarship which recognizes demonstrated excellence of an artistic, creative or athletic nature, the display of leadership ability, or outstanding community service are eligible for recognition.

THINGS TO KNOW

INFORMATION

Accessibility

Graduates and guest with disabilities should be aware that processional routes and Commencement sites are accessible. Special seating for graduates and guest with disabilities will be limited. Because of limited seating capacity, the guest with a disability may be accompanied by one party member. Every effort will be made to seat other party members in the closest adjacent seating area possible. Also, there will be a live telecast room with live captioning at the Bianchi Planetarium (Citrus Hall) and Nobbs Auditorium (Sequoia Hall).

For graduates with disablilities electing to march and be seated with their colleges, ushers will be made available to assist them during the processional and recessional. Please contact the Office of Student Development and Transitional Programs at (818) 677 - 2393 prior to the Commencement Ceremonies to arrange for assistance.

Due to the number of expected participants and guests at Commencement, graduates, their families and guests are reminded that the University is unable to provide wheelchairs, walkers, and other assistive devices of personal nature. Trams and other transportation will not be available. Please review parking information to best assess the most comfortable parking location for your family and guests.

Deaf and Hard of Hearing

Interpreting services for deaf and hard of hearing graduates and guests will be available in a reserved area at each site. Graduates will line up at the graduate check-in area. Look for the designated area marked, "Deaf and Hard of Hearing". A processional marshal will lead grduates to the correct seating location. If you have special needs, please notify the National Center on Deafness at (818) 677 - 2614 (V/TTY).

Emergencies

Police officers from the Department of Police Services and medical staff from the Student Health Center will be on duty during the Commencement exercises to provide first aid in the event of any medical emergencies or illnesses. Police officers will provide the normal standard of public safety services and both police officers and student community service assistants in the red and black uniforms are available to assist guests with lost members, directions and many other services.

NOTE: It will not be possible for any guest to be paged.

Lost and Found

The Department of Police Services maintains a centralized lost and found service for the California State Universty, Northridge community. In the event you lose an item during Commencement, a University police officer or community service assistant can direct you to Police Services Headquarters to file a lost report or check on lost property turned in to the Department of Police Services.

PARKING

Parking charges will be waived for Honors Convocation and on the dates Commencement ceremonies are scheduled. Graduates are encouraged to refer to the Commencement website (www.csun.edu/commencement) for the most up to date information.

For all Commencement ceremonies, the most convenient parking is on the west side of campus (Lots B1, B2 and the B3 parking structure). Please have your guests enter the campus at Nordhoff and Darby (one block east of Reseda Blvd.) and follow the signs to the closest available parking.

Parking for persons with disabilities will be available in the parking lots B1, B2 and all levels of the B3 parking structure. A current state issued "Disabled Person Parking Placecard" or "Disabled Person/Veteran" license plate, issued to an occupant of the vehicle will be required to park in an ADA stall.

NOTE: Graduates and Guests may be directed to overflow parking in the B5 parking Structure in the event of an exceptionally large turnout. Additionally parking for all ceremonies will be available in Lots G3, G4 and F5. Additional disabled parking is available in all lots.

Warning: Please note that although permits will not be enforced, all other violations e.g. red zones, blocking, etc. will be enforced.

SEATING AND PRINTED PROGRAMS

All ceremonies are expected to reach maximum guest capacity. The saving of seats is strictly prohibited as seating is first come first served. We highly encourage that guest arrive with their party members at least 90 minutes prior to the ceremony start time.

Seating charts will be available for guest at the information tents. Similiarly, commencement programs will be available at the same loaction but are limited to one per group. Please be aware that your graduate will be provided with their own program as well.

Those graduates who do not attend Commencement may visit the Office of Student Development and Transitional Programs to receive a printed program. Baccalaureate, Master's and Doctorate candidate names are listed by College. Honors candidates will also be listed in a special section of the program.

NOTE: Due to press deadlines, the printed programs is not a definitive list of all graduates. Further, some students have requested that their names not be published, and therefore, will not appear in the Commencement printed program.

SAFETY AND SECURITY MEASURES

It is our top priority to ensure a safe and memorable experience for all of our graduates and guests at the CSUN Commencement ceremonies. To help e nsure we achieve these goals, all persons entering the commencement venue will be required to go through a security check point that includes a metal detector screening and bag check.

To ensure passage through security checkpoints and timely access to the facility, we highly encourage all guest arrive at least 90 minutes prior to the start of the commencement ceremony start time. Guest will not be allowed to enter the venue with more than one bag. This bag should be easily checked: backpacks will be prohibited. All weapons (including pocket knives) and glass bottles of any kind (wine, beer, and soft drinks) will also be strictly prohibited.

Strollers may be allowed into the Commencement Venue however, will not be permitted in grandstands and in aisle ways. Guest may leave strollers in a designated area outside the commencement venure at their own risk. To be considerate of other guests and graduates we ask that you do not bring noise makers or selfie sticks, utilize umbrellas, or stand in the ailse during the commencemnt ceremony.

Due to the danger of errant balloons hitting power lines, balloons, regardless of type, will not be allowed and will be confiscated if found. Wrapped gifts are discouraged and are subject to be opened if they do not clear a metal detector. Non-uniformed members of law enforcement community may not carry firearms inside the commencement venue. We regret any inconvenience that these security measures may cause, Thank you in advance for your understanding and cooperation as we work to ensure the safetly of our graduates, their families and guests, and our campus community.




In order to ensure a safe and memorable commencement experience, the following items are NOT allowed into the commecement grounds:

Kives and Weapons
Balloons
Wrapped Gifts
Large Backpacks
Air Horns

All bags are subject to search. Metal detectors are to ensure the safety of students, families, and guest attending the ceremony.
