Her books include Persuasions of the Witch's Craft, The Good Parsi, Of Two Minds, and When God Talks Back, which was named a New York Times Notable Book of the Year and a Kirkus Reviews' Best Book of the Year. She is a fellow of the American Academy of Arts and Sciences and recipient of a Guggenheim Fellowship. Her work focusses on how objects without material presence come to seem real to people, and the way that ideas about the mind affect the mental experience.*
