

# Top 25 CSUN Feeder High Schools: Incoming Freshmen Cohorts 2014-2018

**In a series of reports**, IR is sharing data about where our freshman students come from, who they are, and how they are doing. This report focuses on the students admitted to CSUN from the top 25 high school feeders. The analysis examines the five cohorts that were admitted from 2014 to 2018 and their outcomes at CSUN.

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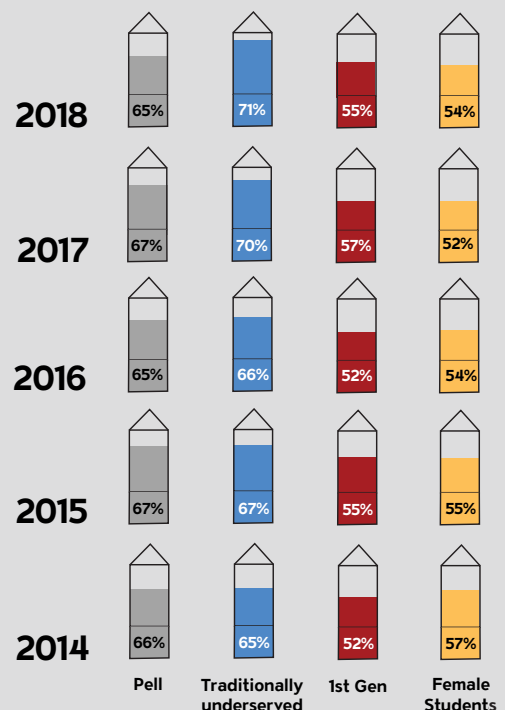


Demographic characteristics and academic performance of CSUN first-time freshman between 2014-2018 are discussed in this report. These data reveal an increase in the rates of traditionally underserved students coming from the top 25 high school feeders. Moreover, students coming from those high schools have shown better academic outcomes than the general CSUN population.

## DEMOGRAPHIC INDICATORS

### Breakdown of 2014-2018 FTF Cohorts

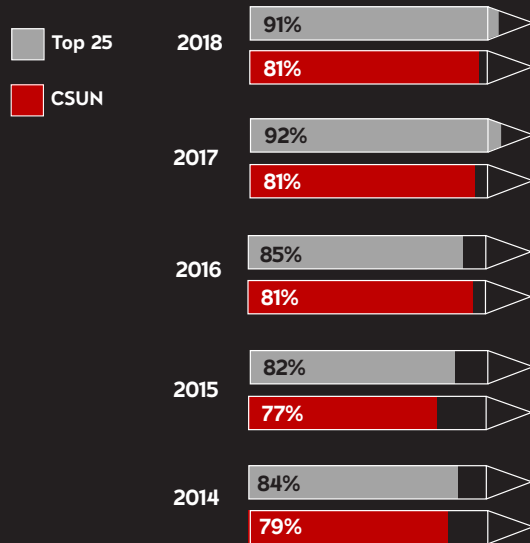
Throughout the five year period under consideration, a majority of students from the top 25 feeder high schools were Latino/a. Pell eligible students constituted 65% or more, the rates of traditionally underserved students was on average 68%, and first-generation students constituted on average 52%. The average rate of incoming female students was 54%.



# ACADEMIC OUTCOMES

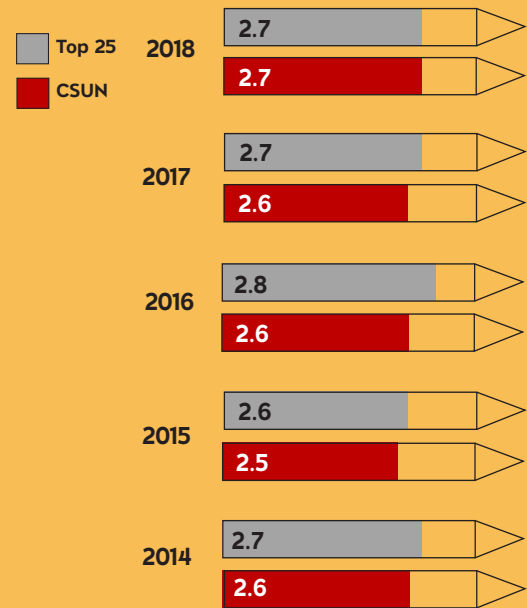
## One-Year Continuation

From 2014 to 2018, the one-year continuation rate of the students from the top 25 feeder high schools increased by 7%, from 83% to 90%. One year continuation rates for the students from the top 25 high school feeders were higher than CSUN's overall.



## Average GPA

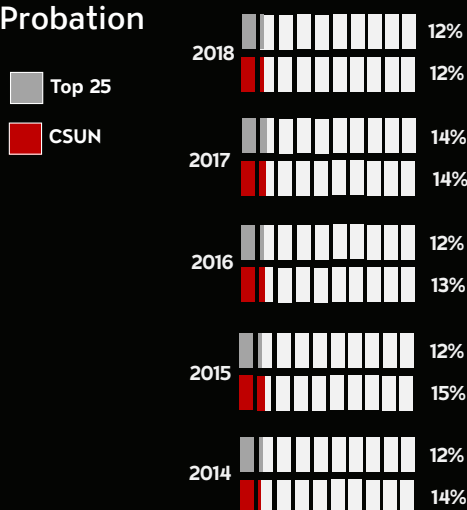
Between 2014-2018, incoming students from top feeder high schools performed better or the same on average than CSUN's overall average GPA. The average GPA per year comparisons are shown in the bar graph below.



## Academic Standing

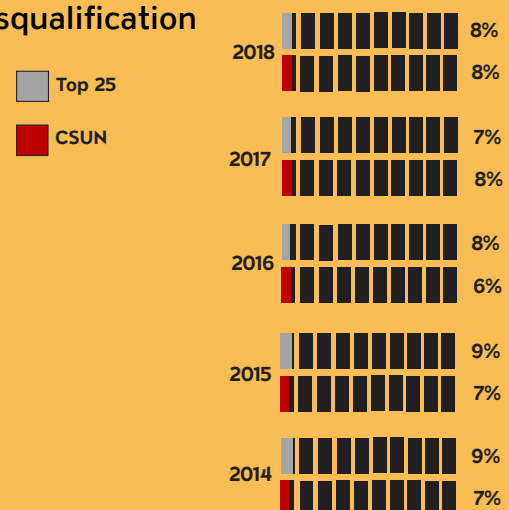
Between 2014-2018, 82% of students from the top 25 feeder high schools had good academic standing at CSUN. Further, the rate of probation and disqualification was lower for students from the top 25 feeder high schools in comparison to CSUN's overall rate. The bar graphs below provide a comparison of these rates.

### On Probation



The rate of students from the top 25 feeder high schools who were on probation after their first year was an average of 12% between 2014-2018, with a slight increase in 2017. Concurrently, CSUN had an average probation rate of 14%.

### Disqualification



Although, the percentages of disqualified students during the five years under consideration increased slightly, the rates of disqualification among the students coming from the top 25 feeder high schools were lower than CSUN's overall disqualification rate.

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
