The California State University, Northridge Department of Police Services is providing this notice of a campus crime alert in order to provide information that may help in avoiding similar crimes or provide information that may assist in solving these crimes, leading to an arrest.

Sexual Battery—Fondling

DATE/TIME OCCURRED: Monday, May 17, 2021 at 5:10 pm

DATE/TIME REPORTED: Tuesday, May 18, 2021 at 9:39 am

LOCATION: Lassen/Zelzah

REPORTED OFFENSE: While the victim was walking, an unknown male suspect rode by on a bicycle and touched the victim on her buttocks. The suspect continued eastbound on Lassen Street and southbound on Zelzah Avenue. This incident is being considered as an on-going crime pattern given similar incidents and suspect description which occurred in the same area on 02/06/2021 and 02/18/2021.



SUSPECT DESCRIPTION: Male, black, medium to heavy build, wearing black hooded sweatshirt, grey pants, dark colored facemask, purple gloves, and red shoes. The suspect was riding a black Fixie bicycle.

CRIME PREVENTION TIPS

Sexual battery is never the fault of the victim. While nothing is fail safe, here are some items that everyone should consider:

- If something makes you feel uncomfortable, trust your instincts call for help and/or leave the area.
- Be active in supporting a safe and respectful community. If you see others engaging in disrespectful or inappropriate actions, speak up and get involved, or contact someone else to assist.
- Be mindful of suspicious activity - If you observe suspicious activity or a crime in progress be a good witness and call the police immediately! Describe exactly what you observed with as many details as possible. Give complete descriptions such as sex, race, age, height, weight, hair color, clothing, tattoos, scars.
- Dialing 911 while on campus will connect you to the University Police. You can also program the CSUN PD dispatch (818) 677-2111 into your cell phone for quick access when needed.
