BATTERY THEFTS FROM MOTOR VEHICLES

DATE TIME: On Tuesday October 23, 2018 at various times between the hours of 08:55 a.m. and 02:30 p.m.

LOCATIONS: Parking Lots F2, G3 and G9 Parking Structures.

REPORTED OFFENSE: Six (6) battery thefts from motor vehicles were reported to have occurred during the date and times noted above. Two unknown suspects stole car batteries from 2003-2010 Toyota Corollas in which hood releases can be manipulated from outside or underneath the vehicle.

SUSPECT INFORMATION: One suspect is described as a Hispanic male, shaved head, wearing a black shirt. No description was reported on the second suspect. The suspects were seen in a silver 1998 to 2000 four door Nissan Altima with no plates.
