TNE follows three principles:

1. Decisions driven by evidence;

improving preparation programs, teaching strategies, and teacher support on the basis of valid and reliable evidence mainly of pupil learning

2. Engagement with the Arts and Sciences;

making teacher preparation--and pupil learning--everyone's responsibility because teacher candidates must learn not just subject matter but how to make subject matter teachable

3. Teaching as an academically taught clinical practice;

insuring that P-12 setting and the university curriculum align and indeed overlap so that theory and practice reinforce one another
